## Augmentative/Alternative Communication:

[Communication Assistance for Youth and Adults \(CAYA\)](#) - CAYA is a province-wide service program that supports adults aged 19 years and older who require an augmentative/alternative communication (AAC) system. SLPs are encouraged to complete the application the January of students' final year of secondary school.

## Home and Community:

[Technology for Living](#) – Ages 9+. Province-wide program providing free environmental control systems that assist people with physical disabilities to control devices in their homes and on the go (smart home tech, automatic door openers, adaptive gaming, etc).
