


Text-to-Speech (Chromebook)

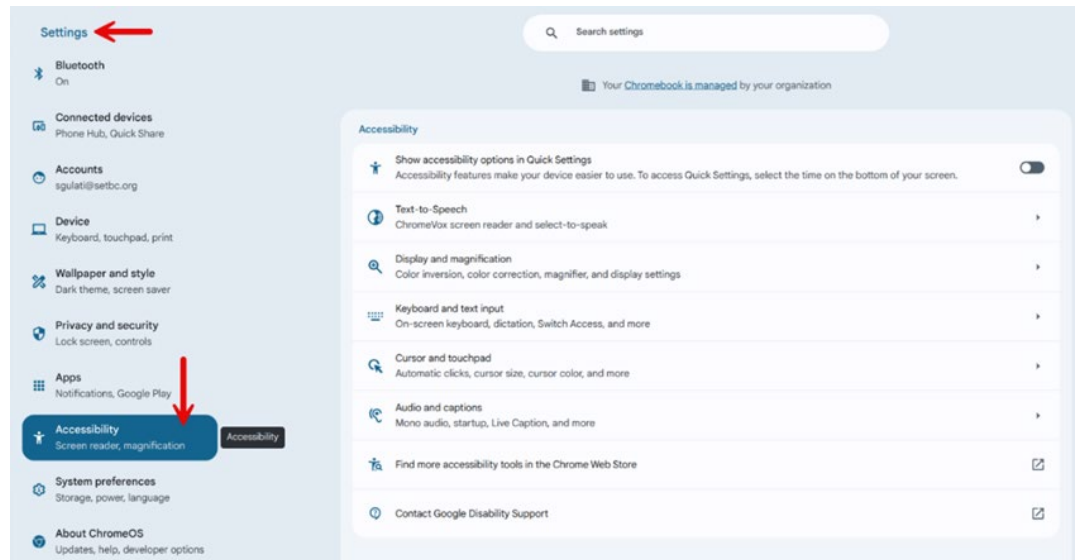
Introduction

Text-to-Speech is a built-in accessibility feature on the Chromebook that allows written text on the screen to be read aloud. This tool can support students with reading by improving access to digital text across apps, websites, and documents. The following demonstrates how to access and use text-to-speech features on a Chromebook.

Steps to Follow

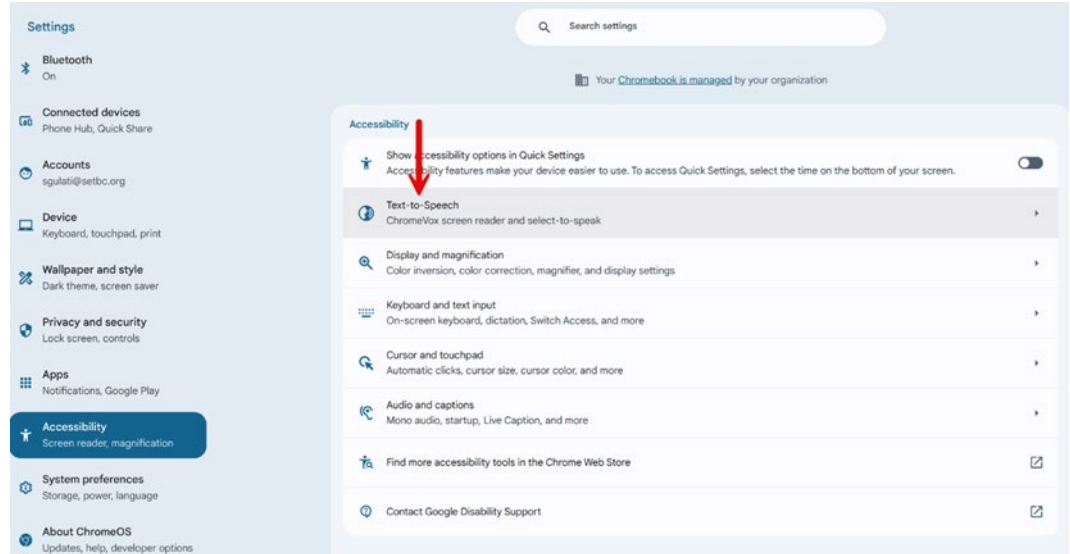

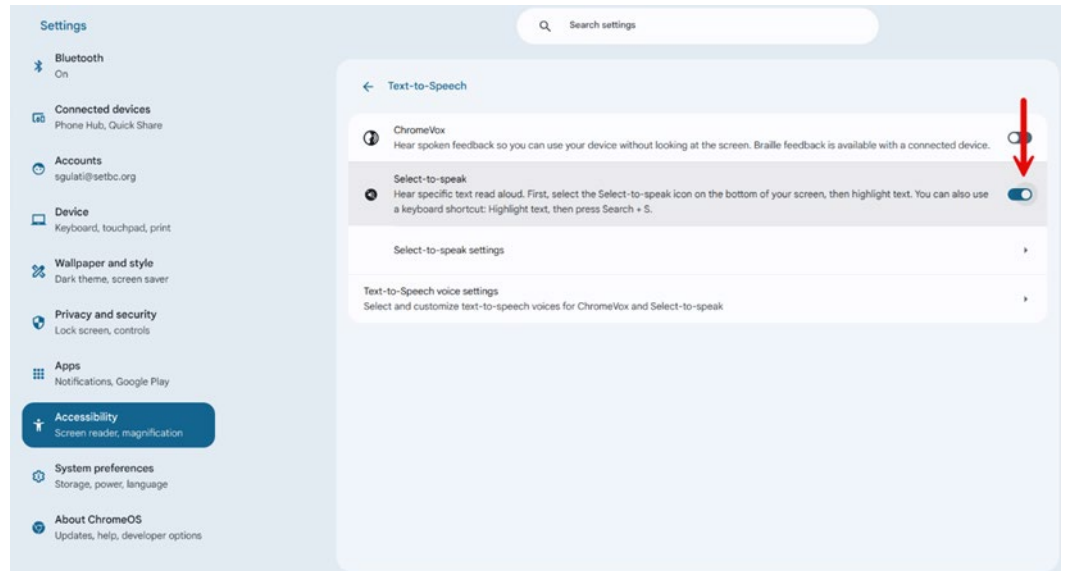

2 Select **Text to Speech.**

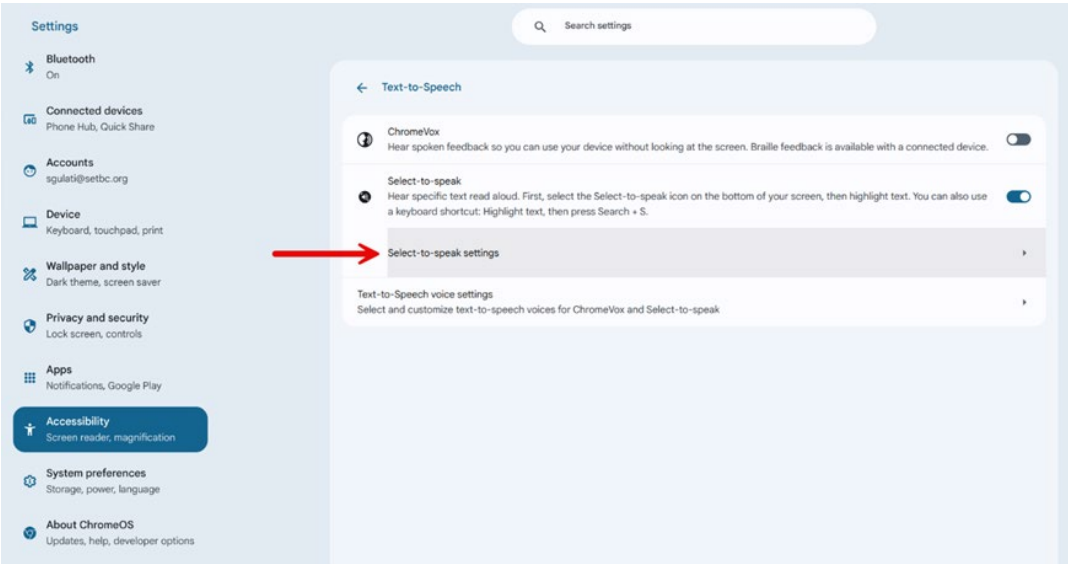


3 Toggle on **Select to Speak.**

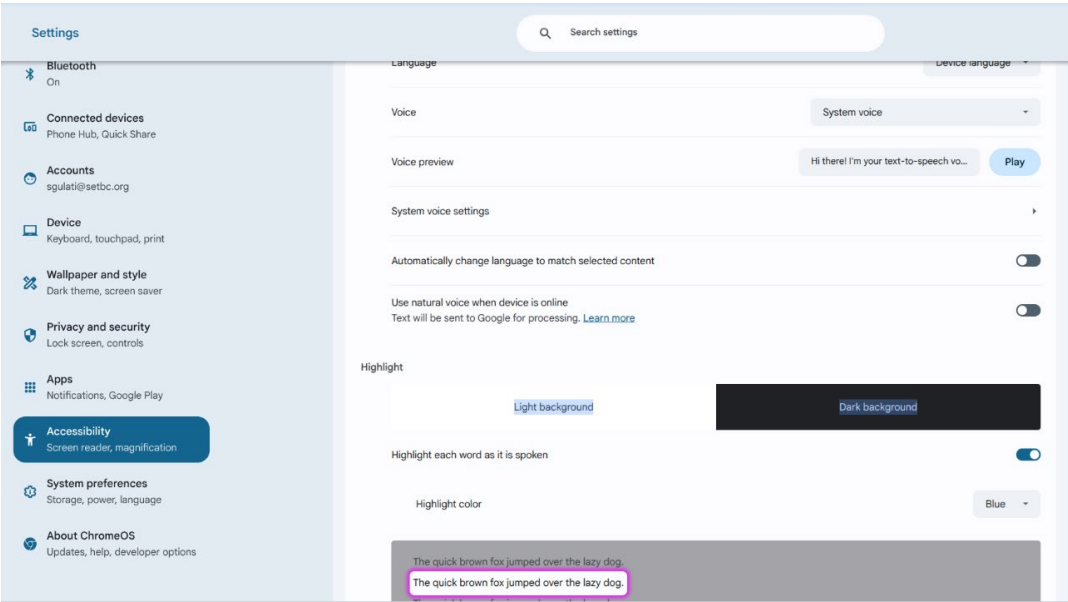


Step Instruction Visual Depiction

4 Click on **Select-to-speak settings.**

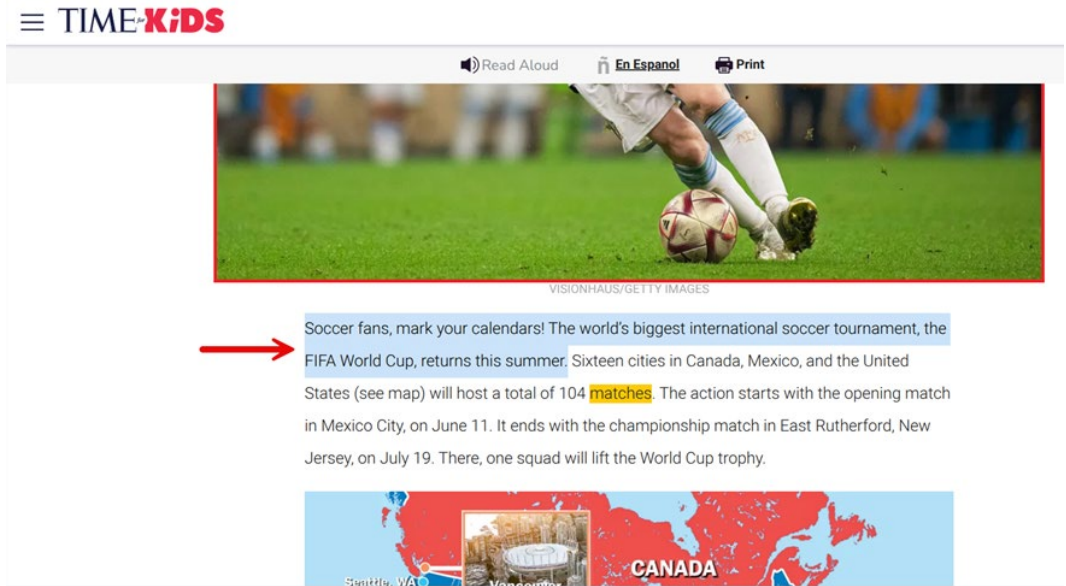


5 In this window you can adjust the language, choose a different voice, and change how text is highlighted and read aloud.

6 Navigate to a window with selectable text. Select the text you want read aloud and press **Search + S** on your keyboard.



7 A navigation control will pop up. This allows you to pause, play, adjust the speed, or skip lines while it's reading
