

Read&Write for Google Chrome – Web Search

Introduction

The Web Search feature allows the user a quick way to research information by searching the web for relevant information about a topic. This may be useful for students doing research on a subject, and/or if the dictionary tool does not provide enough information.

Case Study


Web Search using Read&Write for Google Chrome

Open a web page in your Chrome Browser. (1)

Ensure that the Read&Write Chrome extension is running by locating the purple R&W icon will appear in the top right hand corner.


Click on the icon (2) to activate the Read&Write toolbar.



Select the text to be searched (1).

Click on the *Web Search* icon (2).



<p>3</p>	<p>A new tab will open that will contain a google search of the selected topic (1).</p>	
<p>4</p>	<p>Note: This feature may need to be activated in the <i>Settings</i> section if it does not appear on your toolbar when you are on a webpage.</p> <p>Click on the <i>Settings</i> gear (1).</p> <p>Click on the <i>Features</i> tab (2).</p> <p>Toggle the <i>Web Search</i> feature on if it is turned off (3).</p> <p>Click <i>OK</i> when complete (4).</p>
