

Tutorial: OrbitNote

Introduction

This tutorial provides an overview of how to access and use the OrbitNote tool to read, edit, and extend learning with PDFs. This tool is available as a website and Chrome extension. It allows students to use many of the Read&Write for Google Chrome tools and supports with PDFs.

- Activating your OrbitNote account.
- Accessing Orbitnote tools on PDFs.
- Activating the OrbitNote extension on your Google Chrome browser.





- You have familiarity with some of the tools on the Read&Write toolbar.
- You have internet access.



Case Study



You teach a classroom of diverse students who would benefit from extra literacy support. Your teaching content includes lots of PDFs, and you would like students to be able to access, comprehend, and work on these PDFs on their computers. OrbitNote will allow students to have PDF content read aloud, translated, defined, and to dictate, draw, type, and interact with the PDFs in other ways.



Steps to Follow


Step	Instruction	Visual Depiction
1	Open your Chrome Browser, and navigate to the OrbitNote website (https://orbit.texthelp.com/)	
2	Select your account type (Google, Microsoft, or Unilogin) and log in. If it is your first time logging in, you will be prompted to allow permissions. Select “Allow” and you will be sent to the Orbitnote dashboard.	
3	From the dashboard, you can choose to drag and drop or click to upload a PDF saved locally on your computer or from your Google Drive.

4	Once you open your PDF with OrbitNote enabled, you will notice many icons similar to those you’ve used with Read&Write for Google Chrome, but enabled for PDF use.	
5	The speech tools are Click to Speak, Play, Pause, and Stop.	
6	Dictionary, Picture Dictionary, Screenshot Reader, Translator, Vocabulary List, Screen Mask, Highlights, and Collect Highlights tools all work the same way as with Read&Write for Google Chrome. Please see other tutorials for more information on these tools and how they work.	
7	Unique to OrbitNote are the PDF supports on the right side of the toolbar.	

Step	Instruction	Visual Depiction
8	The shapes tool allows users to draw shapes. This can be especially useful for creating text boxes, shapes for Math, diagrams, or infographics. To delete a shape, select the eraser and then the shape	
9	Freehand drawing allows you to draw anything freehand, which is great for diagrams, labelling, or drawing within PDFs. The eraser can also be used to erase drawings.	

Step	Instruction	Visual Depiction
10	The text box tool allows you to add text to the PDF. Many supports are available within this tool, including play to hear content read back, word prediction, Talk & Type to dictate, and customizable font sizes and colours. To dispose of a draft, select the delete icon on the right.	
11	The pushpin allows you to add an expandable point of information to the PDF. This is great for reducing clutter on assignments and adding interactivity. All of the text support features from the text box tool are also available here.

12	There are a few different ways that you can access the OrbitNote tools to use with your PDFs. As well as methods from Step 3, you can access OrbitNote from any PDF saved in your Google Drive by opening the PDF, selecting “Open With”, and choosing OrbitNote.	
13	To access OrbitNote with a web PDF, or when using OneDrive, you must enable the OrbitNote Chrome Extension. From the OrbitNote dashboard, under resources select “Install Extension”. You will need to select “Add to Chrome”, and the extension will be added to the top right corner of your browser.
