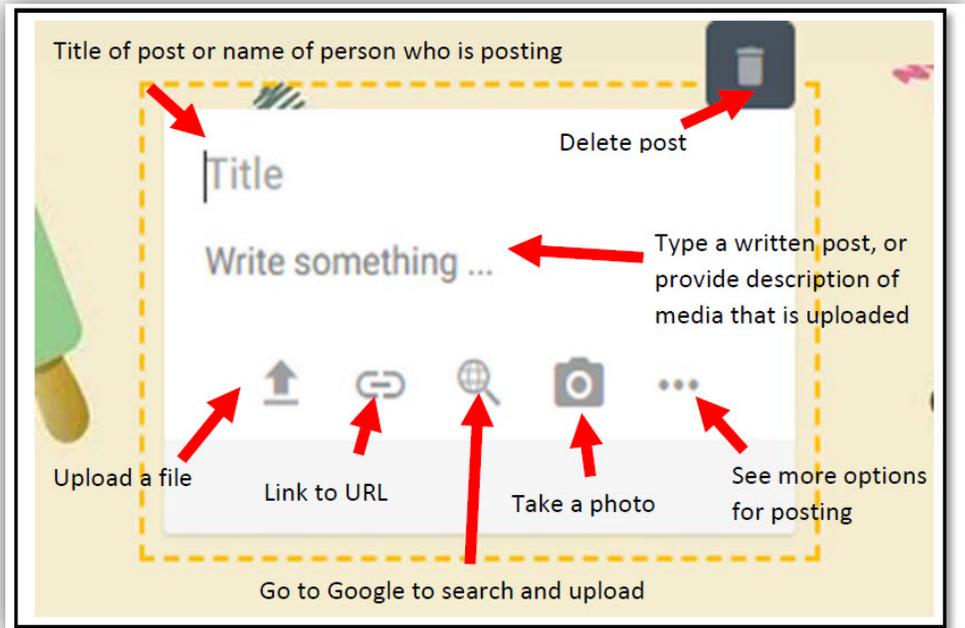


Introduction

Padlet is a digital bulletin board that allows users to share ideas through text, voice recordings, photos, videos, drawings, file uploads, and URL links. Padlet can be used by individual students, or collaboratively by groups. Padlet is available for use as a web-based tool, or can be downloaded as an iOS or Android app.

Task Challenge Activity

- You will need to create a free Padlet account to create Padlets.
- An internet connection is needed for Padlet creation and collaboration.

Create A Padlet:

- Register for a free Padlet account (if necessary) and log in
- Create a new Padlet by clicking “make a padlet”
- Choose your layout
- Customize your Padlet from the selections available click and “next”
- Choose your privacy settings and click “next”

Post To Your Padlet:

- Click the pink circle with the addition icon in the bottom right corner
- Give your post a title
- Choose your method of representation from the bottom menu, and see more options by clicking the three grey dots in the bottom right corner of the box

Interact With Other Posts:

- Click “add comment” below the post to enter your comment
