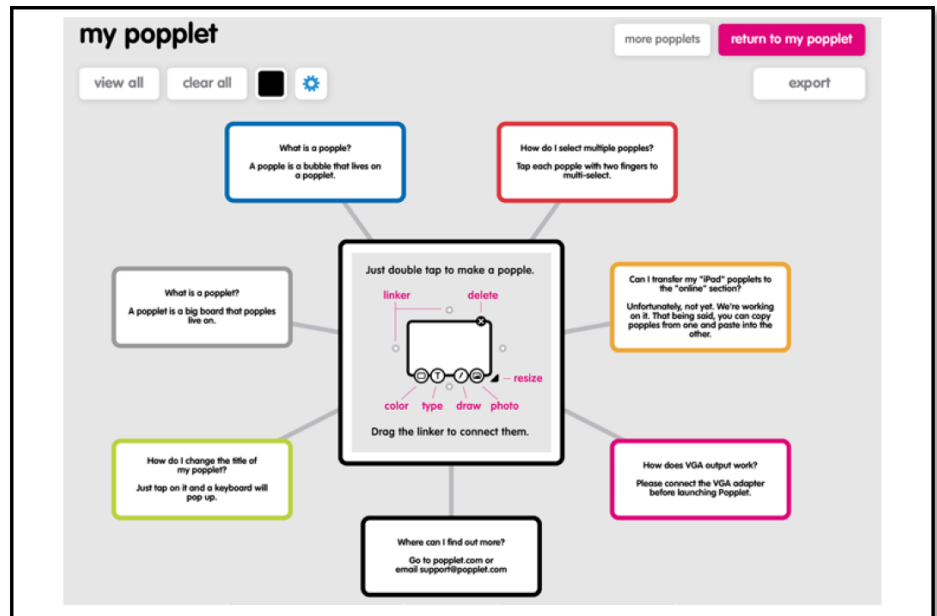


# Popplet/Popplet Lite

## Introduction



Popplet is a web-based and app-based tool. Popplet Lite is also available as an iOS app. Popplet may be used as an instructional and learning tool to organize, and present ideas through multi-modal concept maps, which may include text, drawings, and images.

## Task Challenge Activity

- Either download the Popplet/Popplet Lite app onto your iOS device from the App Store or go to [www.popplet.com](http://www.popplet.com) to use the web-based version.
- Once you have opened the app or logged into the web-based version, double-click on the screen to create a popple (bubble).
- Once your popple appears, you are able to change the colour of your popple, or add text, a drawing and media. You may also resize or delete it.
- You can also create additional popples by click on a linker on the on the outside of the popple.
- You can also change the background colour of your Popplet from the toolbar at the top of the page.
- Once your Popplet is complete, you may print it or export it as a PDF or JPEG.
